At the core of **IADC**'s mission is an imperative to promote the highest standards of stewardship in industry safety standards, environmental integrity and operational efficiency.

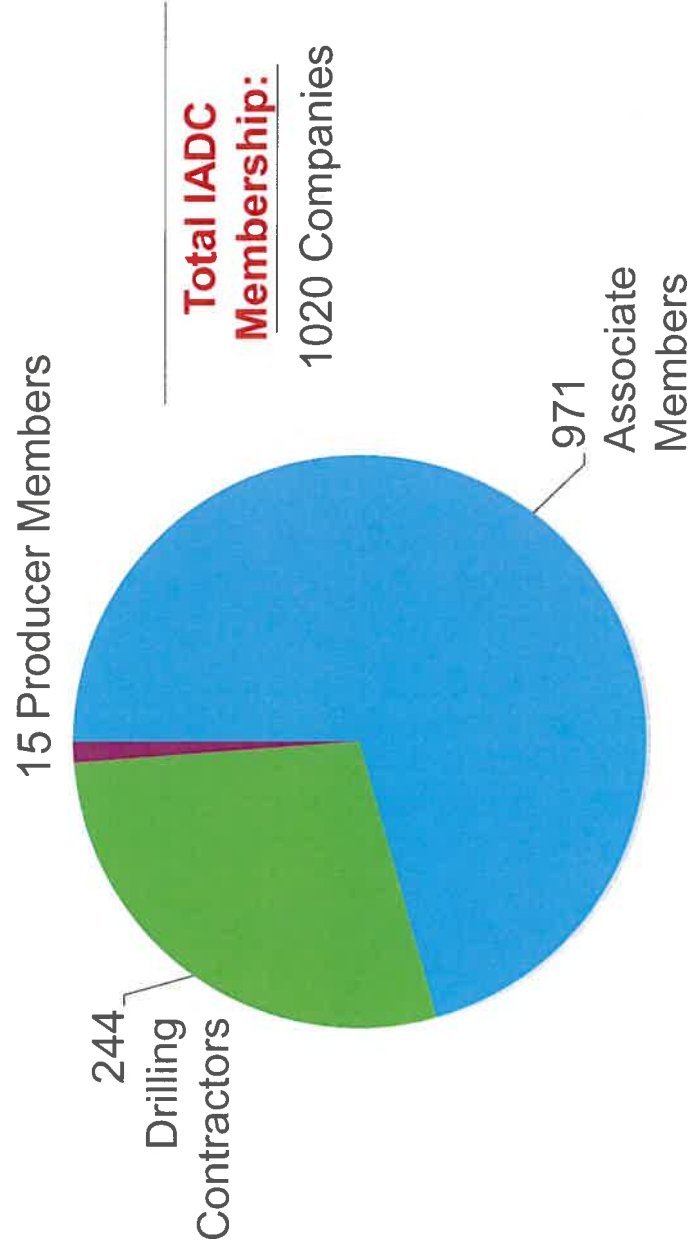


Types of IADC Memberships

Unlike other chapters we have an offshore and an onshore chairman

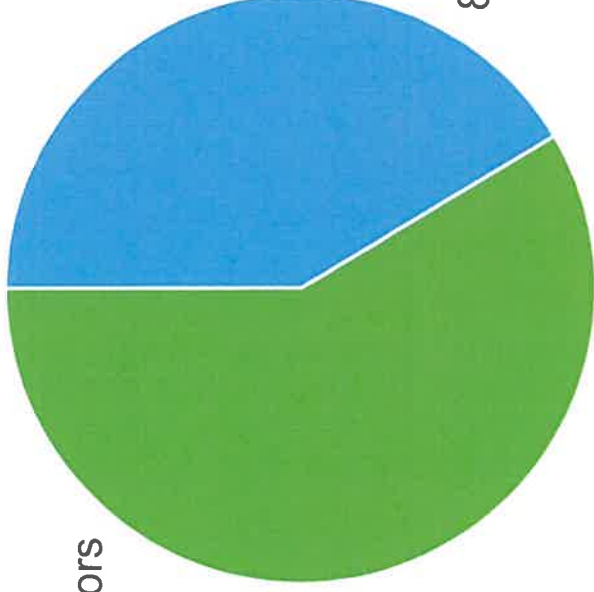
This is rooted in the geography of Australia where nearly all offshore activity is in Western Australia and nearly all onshore activity in the Eastern States.

6 Chapters in USA and 2 Chapters in India.



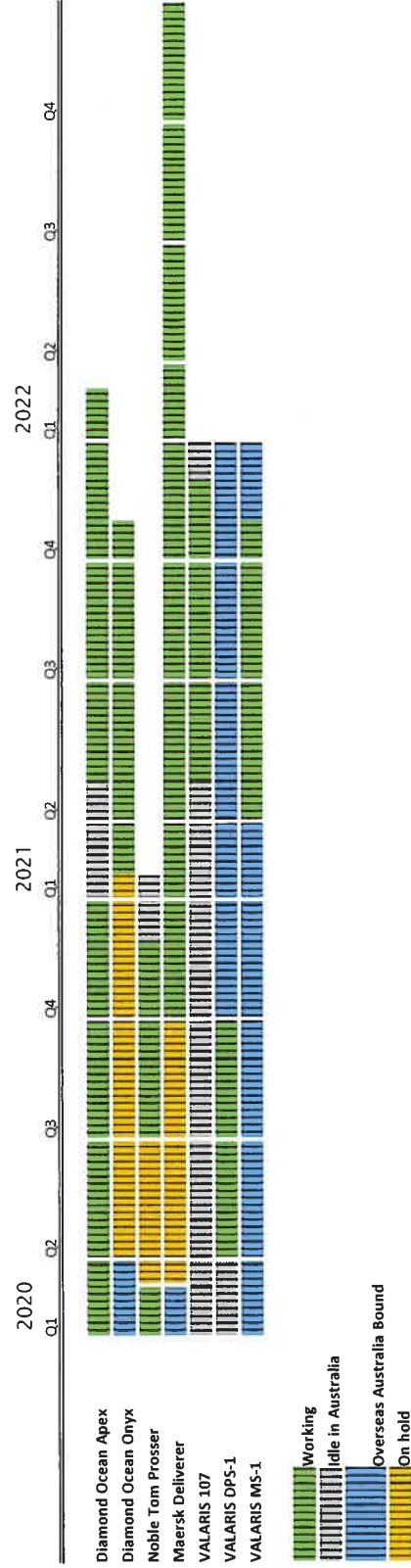

- Transocean Rigs DD1 and KG2 departed Australia
- Diamond Ocean Apex off contract January 21 back on contract May 21 to March 22
- Diamond Ocean Onyx contracted from February 2021 - estimated 300 days of work
- Noble Tom Prosser completed contract with Exxon, mobilised to Darwin to undergo maintenance and wait for work
- Maersk Deliverer on contract and drilling
- VALARIS 107 waiting on contract start up Q2 - 2021
- VALARIS DPS-1 demobilised overseas - return to Australia not known
- VALARIS MS-1 not in Australia - due to arrive here for 6 months work in May 2021
